Aoife

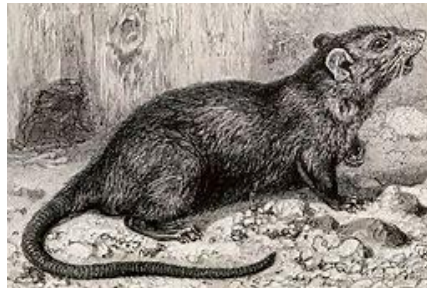
One day the soldiers heard their king say, "I want to kill Thomas Beckett!" so they went and they did kill him but Henry DID NOT want him killed.
