

 Witt Doctor of Laws and Chancellor by the oath of David Stroves and John
 Stroves the executors to whom administration was granted having been first
 sworn duly to administer

of me Elizabeth Nash of Oxford in the County of Oxon Widow of
 William Nash late of Oxford aforesaid former baronet In the first place
 I direct that all my just debts funeral and testamentary expences be in the
 first place fully paid and satisfied by my executor hereinafter named
 out of my personal estate as soon as conveniently may be after my de-
 cease I give and bequeath unto my servant James King the sum of
 one hundred pounds sterling as a reward for his long and faithful ser-
 vices to me clear of all deductions Also I give and bequeath unto the
 said James King all my wearing apparel linnen and except what my
 dear sister in law Elizabeth Nash widow of my deceased brother in law
 John Nash may select and choose hereout for her use provided that it
 shall be living at the time of my decease Also I give and bequeath
 unto the said James King the sum of one hundred pounds sterling to
 be by her received of and from my executor for the use and benefit of
 her child Edward King at her birth and where said legacy shall
 to be paid clear of all deductions And as to all and singular the rest
 residue and remainder of my household goods and furniture plate
 linen ready money securities for money shares of the public stocks ex-
 tending to my personal estate and effects whatsoever and whosoever
 and of what nature or kind ever and not heretofore disposed of
 whether in possession reversion or remainder and over which I have any

power of disposition or appointment I give and bequeath the same and every part thereof unto and to the use of my nephew Robert John Clark of Office Sheriff of Middlesex Son of my Brother law Benjamin Clark late of Gooden Green in the parish of St Paul in the said County of West Essexman created To hold the same unto the said Robert John Clark his heirs executors and administrators for ever subject nevertheless and I do hereby charge and make liable the residue of my said estate and effects to given and bequeathed to the said Robert John Clark to and with the payment of one annuity or yearly sum of thirty pounds sterling unto my said sister in law Elizabeth Clark by two equal half yearly payments (clear of all deductions) for and during the term of her natural life the first payment thereof to begin and be made at the end of six calendar months next after my decease and I do nominate and appoint the said Robert John Clark sole executor of this my will and I do hereby revoke all former wills by me at any time heretofore made and declare this to be my last will and testament In witness whereof I the said Elizabeth Clark have to this my last will and Testament contained in one sheet of paper set my hand and seal the twenty second day of May one thousand eight hundred and forty six Elizabeth Clark Signed sealed published and declared by the said Elizabeth Clark as and for her last will and Testament in the presence of us who at her request in her presence and in the presence of each other have subscribed our names as witnesses thereto Henry Murray Postmaster Swinwick - Charles Swinwick Grocer Wyford

Proved at London the 11th June 1855 before the Reverend Doctor Thomas Pratt Doctor of Law and Surrogate by the oath of Robert John Clark the nephew the sole executor to whom a power was granted lawfully then first sworn duly to administer.

of me Edward Stephen Stokes of the Great Ormeau Road in the parish of Saint Nicholas Southford in the County of West Essexman Visited Great Ormeau all my just debts and my funeral and testamentary expenses to be paid by my executors administrators or assigns out of my residuary personal estate hereinafter given and bequeathed to her I give and bequeath unto my dear Great Nephew James Carter all that my two tenements messuages and premises with their appurtenances situate in St Martin's Alley and the Strand Street in Dover in the County of Kent To hold to my said dear Great Nephew James Carter his executors administrators and assigns for all the unexpired residue of my term therein granted by Indenture of Lease bearing the sixth day of January in the year of our Lord one thousand eight hundred and fourteen and made between the Honourable Warthen and assistants of the Harbour of Dover in the County of Kent of the one part and myself (by the name of Edward Stokes) and my late sister Margaret Stokes deceased of the other part subject to the payment of the rent by the same Indenture of Lease reserved and to the performance of the covenants therein contained I give and bequeath unto my dear wife Margaret Stokes all my household furniture and all other the residue of my personal estate and effects to and for her own absolute use and benefit subject to the payment of my just debts funeral and testamentary expenses as aforesaid And I appoint my said dear wife Margaret Stokes sole executrix of this my will I do hereby expressly revoke and make void all other wills by me at any time heretofore made and declare this and now shall to be and contain my whole last will and Testament In witness whereof I have hereto subscribed my name the nineteenth
